We welcomed the new year with our local church folks. After a service, where our Pastor challenged us from God’s word we had a meal, a bunch of singing, games and fellowship until a few hours into the new year. We pray that it will be a fruitful year of blessing on the national church.

The first part of the year leading up to Carnival (Mardi Gras) is always an interesting time to be here. Every Sunday afternoon the grease-panted “mandinga warriors” parade through the streets with drums, dances and a huge mob of people. Their role is to resurrect the “spirit of Carnival”, which they mourned with a funeral at the end of Carnival last year. To see the money, time and effort made in the celebration of the sensuality and carnality is always a heartbreaking thing. May God be merciful to open the eyes of the people in this city to the Light!

Bro. Cesar and I have continued evangelizing in the zone of Ribeirinha every Friday afternoon. The Bible studies that we had set up sort of fizzled out, and we are praying for other opportunities as we speak to people in the streets. Outwardly, it has not been extremely fruitful. I am thankful for the reminder of our utter dependence on God’s power. We continue to plant seeds and we pray that as we faithfully plant that God would bring forth the lasting fruit that only He can produce!

Please pray for a few young men from the “therapeutic community” (drug rehab center) that have been attending services when they are out for the weekend. As the people in this program near the end of their six months they are gradually allowed to have longer periods to spend with family outside the community. We are thankful for those that have shown spiritual interest. Our weekly Bible study in the community was changed to Thursdays instead of Saturdays which has been a blessing as we get to see all the residents not just those that remain there during the weekends. This gives us the full six months to work with all the residents. Our prayer for these folks continues to be that they would find true lasting deliverance and freedom in Christ!

Our family is doing well, other than a touch of the “gripe” our version of a cold/flu that is working its way through our ranks. The kids are plowing through their year of homeschool. Pray for Tina and I as we invest in our own children in their studies and their development. This is an investment that we must not take lightly!
