SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAM

Our ministry is continuing to evolve. We realize that even if we feed the children on Saturdays, they will still suffer if their parents are unemployed. We continue to be burdened as many children fall into the dangers of human trafficking because of poverty. So the Lord led us to start a skills training ministry for the parents of the kids in our feeding ministry. We started this along with a brother in Christ in Ohio who sponsored the initial needs for equipment. Last month, the first batch of students completed their training. We had 10 individuals attended the classes which focused three important aspects: Spiritual, Safety and Skills. We praise God that these 10 have accepted Christ during the course of the training and several have been bringing even their whole family to church in the past two Sundays.



NEW KIDS IN HOME

Please pray for these two new kids in the children's home. CJ (8) and Junior (7) attended the feeding ministry under the church that our eldest son David pastors. After losing their mother, they were abandoned by their father in the care of their elderly grandmother who only sells food in the sidewalk to survive. Last week, she admitted that she could no longer feed the boys and transferred their care to our ministry. They are malnourished and will need to undergo medical exam to assess their health. They have also never had a chance to attend any formal schooling and are non-readers. Please help us pray for them.



JUNIOR CAMP AND ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION.

Last June 9, our church celebrated its 21st anniversary. We had the honor to have the Youth Outreach Ministry Team from Pensacola Christian College visit us during the Sunday service which was attended by our main church members in the morning and the members of our seven daughter churches in the afternoon. We had a total of 300 in attendance in our afternoon service and we praise God for this God-honoring celebration.
