While traveling on furlough, we have had the opportunity to visit many of our current supporting churches as well as some new churches who are interested in partnering with the ministry in Uganda. One of the benefits of traveling is getting to spend time with friends from Bible college and seeing how God is using them in the places that He has called them; but, the challenge of traveling is meeting new people, becoming friends, and having to say goodbye the very next day. For Carson, this has been particularly hard because he enjoys making new friends, but the “goodbye” is always very difficult. However, he is doing well in his schooling while on the road. We took him on his first field trip to the Point Defiance Zoo in Washington. Additionally, it has been very exciting to take Carson to some baseball games over the last month. He enjoys eating hot dogs and yelling “CHARGE” during the rally calls over the loudspeaker.

In August, we will spend some time with my sister, Brianna, and her husband, Moises, in California. We will also travel to Bowie, TX, and enjoy five days at our former linguistics school. Toward the end of the month, we have a missions conference in Baton Rouge, LA, followed by our return to Abbey’s family in Greenwood, IN. During the last week of August, I will be flying to Gordon, NE, to be in the wedding of a close friend from Bible college.

- 1. Our meetings.** This month, we will be visiting eight churches. Please pray that we will be an encouragement to the churches and challenge those attending to do more for the cause of Christ.

- 3. My father’s health.** He was given a “no activity” report regarding his brain cancer. He will continue to have blood work done every quarter to ensure the tumor remains dormant. Please continue to pray for the extreme neuropathy pain that he is experiencing in both of his legs.
- 4. More People to Surrender to Worldwide Missions.** While the need for more laborers in North America is still very great, we also need more laborers to surrender to be used of God around the world.
